

Sexual Violence Training Program:
Creating dialogue around immigrant and minority experiences

The New York Asian Women's Center in partnership with the New York City Alliance Against Sexual Assault, and sponsored by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, will be conducting a training to build awareness of and change attitudes and responses to sexual assault among students in New York City college campuses.

The training is restricted to CUNY-network students only. Students will gain an increased knowledge about sexual assault as well as acquire concrete tools to engage community members in speaking out against all forms of sexual violence. Students will need to be present in New York City from mid-June to early July for two-day training and a follow-up interview.
