Practitioners have often noted the challenges of applying clinical concepts and skills derived from a Euro-American model in working with Asian clients. As befitting the values of individualism, the Euro-American model emphasizes direct expression of thoughts and feelings and delineation of clear professional boundaries in the helping process. These norms are drastically different from the Asian collectivistic cultural values that emphasize interdependence with others, anticipation of others' needs and keeping personal thoughts and feelings private.

How do practitioners in the Asian community reconcile these differences? What is the Asiacentric clinical model from a cross-cultural perspective?

- The adaptation of clinical approaches in working with Asian clients across the lifespan
